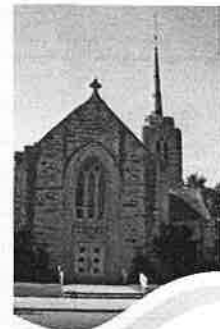

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I really enjoy writing these reflections for the bulletin. They grant me the opportunity to put into words many of the thoughts and experiences I have on a daily basis and share them with you. Unfortunately, I sometimes have the regrettable habit of procrastinating, and much to the chagrin of our secretaries Malia and Melissa, I often don't get them finished until hours before the entire bulletin is due to be printed!

Now, I don't claim to be busier than the average person. All of us have the demands of work, family, and life put upon us on a daily basis. The sad fact of the matter is that all the technologies and innovations that were meant to save us time and energy have only served to increase what is expected of us. Suddenly, without our even realizing it, our lives begin to slip away from us. Priorities get turned around, and often the most important things in life are lost or forgotten.

And prayer is often the first thing to go. Think about it. When life gets too busy and something needs to be taken off the schedule, our relationship with God suffers. Our minds are preoccupied with buying groceries, picking up the kids after school, getting the oil changed in our cars, finishing that project for work, and trying not to lose our sanity in the process! In fact, we feel pretty good about simply making it to Mass every Sunday!

So, with all this in mind, and with my own struggles finding time to pray in the midst of life's busy-ness, I offer this little trick of the trade:

Make your car your chapel. Every year, the average American spends over 300 hours driving. Imagine if we used that time to turn off our stereos, switch off the radios, and give praise to our God! Imagine how different our mood would be when we arrived at work after talking things over with God on our morning commute. Imagine the impact on our kids if we shared prayer with them before dropping them off at school. Imagine what would happen to our road-rage and lead-feet if we drove through life in the silence of God's peace. And imagine how relaxing it would be to hand over all the stress and anxiety of the work place to God as we drove home to our loving families. Imagine it!

It may be a small thing to change in our lives, but it's often the smallest changes that make the biggest difference. Before writing this piece, I took it upon myself to taste my own medicine. And you know what? It works! I found myself praying for my family and those who asked me to pray for them. I prayed for the strength I needed to help those in need. I prayed for peace of mind and a loving heart. And when I'd arrive at my destination and step out of my vehicle, I just felt better. I felt happier and more confident and more loving. I felt like God was walking right beside me.

As Archbishop Buechlein used to say, "There's no wrong way to pray." God uses whatever means we have to make a connection with Him, and if that means praying at 55mph on 40, then so be it. Of the three commitments we make during Lent of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, I would argue prayer takes pride of place. So let us not miss out on this opportunity to grow in our faith. Let's transform our very cars into mobile chapels and leave the rest to God. Amen.

A Real Scare Comes

One of the early games many parents, including myself, with our children involves a fake scare. A mom or dad hides their face behind their hands and suddenly reveals themselves while saying, "BOO!" The child giggles at their silliness.

Being frightened is fun until the day when the child experiences a real scare. Then it's no laughing matter. The first real scare sometimes involves separation from their parent. The child wanders away innocently, moving from one attraction to another. But as soon as the child realizes they are lost, they panic and let out a loud cry of alarm. The parent immediately comes running to reassure the child that they are not alone. As we get older, our fake scares get more sophisticated like scary books or movie, amusement park rides and so on. Being scared becomes so invigorating that we begin to take bigger risks for bigger thrills.

But when a real scare comes, like a sudden death, a divorce, loss of job, sickness and so on, we may realize that we are in danger or lost, we panic. Our call for help does not require a sophisticated words or a well-reasoned defense, just a desperate cry for help. Like a loving parent, God responds to comfort and guide us by sending people in our lives to help us through our trials and tribulations. May we pray for the courage and strength to trust God when a real scare comes!!

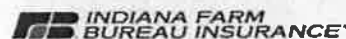
