Stewardship Of Time

"Lord, quiet my soul so that I can spend time with you in Prayer"

God has gifted each of us with 24 hours in each day. It is important to effectively manage those hours. We should balance the hours we spend at work, with our families, in prayer, in recreation, and in service to God. Each of these commitments is important and we must ask ourselves: Do we spend quality time with our family? Do we spend an appropriate portion of our time utilizing our talents for the good of others in our parish and community? Most importantly do we spend meaningful time in prayer each day?

Stewardship Of Talent

As we listen to these words at the end of Mass, we are reminded that a good steward is one who responds to the love of God in many ways. At St. Margaret Mary Parish we have many ways to put these words into practice. Part of being an active member of our parish is to contribute our talents in many places and situations where they can best be put to use. Part of being a welcoming community is being open to the talents of each member. This is why each year we invite all parishioners to make commitments of their talents. Your gift of your talents is what makes St. Margaret Mary a vibrant parish community.

Stewardship Of Treasure

At St. Margaret Mary we encourage each other to be better stewards of our money, setting aside a generous offering to the parish each week. This is an important part of our Stewardship Renewal. Each of us has the responsibility, and the inherent desire, to help others in need and to support the ministry of our parish, as well as other worthwhile charitable organizations. All of us have different levels of material resources, but we are all called to return in thanksgiving a proportionate gift, each in a measure with which we have been blessed.


Why Give a Percentage? Why should we determine the amount of our gift based on a percentage of income? First, because the tithe (10%) is a scriptural benchmark which the Church has honored for centuries (see Malachi 3:10). Secondly, we give a percentage of income because it is a common-sense standard by which everyone can equitably support the parish, each according to his or her ability.



Liturgy And Spiritual Life Commission

ART AND ENVIRONMENT

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION

Eucharistic Ministers are an indispensable part of our Eucharistic celebrations. They assist the priest in the distribution of Holy Communion at Mass and, in the absence of a priest, at Services of Holy Communion. Some make home visits, bringing the gift of the Lord and their faith to the sick and home-bound.

GREETERS

LECTORS

These men and women minister to the parish during Mass and other liturgies in the proclamation of Scripture. They devote time and preparation to understand the Word of God so that all may hear and be open to God transforming their lives.

SACRISTANS

SHUT-IN MINISTRY

This group of volunteers regularly visits and brings the Eucharist to the homebound of the parish and the nursing homes on the south side of Terre Haute. Their visit brings the caring support to those who are no longer able to attend parish activities and notifies the pastor and parish leaders of special sacramental needs such as the Anointing of the Sick or Reconciliation.

YOUTH CHOIR

The Youth Choir, which is open to children in 1st through 8th grade, leads the singing at a children-oriented liturgy on Sunday mornings once a month during the school year. Additionally, the choir welcomes younger children to join in providing special prelude music for the Christmas Eve Family Centered Mass.
